Clerkships at YMBBMAC

- Legal work in practice areas including; native title law, mining and petroleum law, contract law, aboriginal heritage and environmental law.
- Exposure to native title claims in litigation and mediation; and
- Exposure to mining and future act negotiations.

Clerkship Options:

General Clerkships

General clerkships with YMBBMAC are completed in the Perth office over a two or four week period during university breaks.

One-day-a-week Clerkship

Complete your clerkship by volunteering one day a week over ten weeks during second semester.

Regional Office Clerkship

Complete your clerkship in one of our regional offices. Advantages include the opportunity to meet our clients, attend working group meetings and become involved in heritage surveys. General research tasks are also a part of completing a clerkship in a regional office.

How to apply

We request that all applications for volunteer native title research clerkships be made within the period set by the WA Law Society in the Articled Clerk Recruitment Monitoring Scheme (see <http://www.lawsocietywa.asn.au>).

Applications generally close a few weeks after first semester commences, interviews are then held and offers will then be made six weeks later.

Applications should consist of a short curriculum vitae including academic records and a brief cover letter explaining your interest in the position.
